Foundation of the Low Country, it was possible for us to purchase our new building with a \$120,000.00 grant and help from Palmetto State Bank, who holds the mortgage on the building. George David (BJVIM Board Chair), Deborah Burt (BJVIM Board Treasurer) and Pam signed the closing documents to purchase our new home at 29 Plantation Business Park, Building 6. This purchase would not have been possible without the hard work of all our volunteers. This building is a testament to how hard everyone involved in BJVIM carries out our mission. Construction is now taking place to remove two walls, build two offices, remove doors in the halls and build shelving in the pharmacy. We are now beginning to pack. Thanks to the hard work of our grants committee, Susan Bryant, Mary Ellen Hill, Tom Blake, David Pike, Nancy Harris, Alan Metevia (from his new home in New England) we are continuing to raise funds for patient programs. We recently received a grant from St. Francis Thrift shop for a small "tablet", stand and program to track patient satisfaction and hospital visits. This information currently is being calculated by a paper survey that Hannah then has to collate. Many free clinics use this program and we are excited to be able to offer this service to our patients.

Also, we have received a grant to expand and create the donor development program. As we move into our new building and expand our services we need to look at additional ways to generate donations. We will receive part of the grant money this year and the balance in 2019.

This is the first time we have been awarded a two-year grant, once again Thanks to the Community Foundation of the Lowcountry.

Christmas in July was a huge success! Initially we raised \$15,000.00. An unexpected gift came our way as Brenda Thomas, the recipient of the Biltmore get-a-way, donated the money back to BJVIM! This brings the total funds raised to \$17,400!
