2021 COVID-19 Vaccinations

Our state SC Free Clinic Association and the National Association for Free and Charitable Clinics have been working very hard to secure COVID-19 vaccinations for free clinics. We are very hopeful that we will be in line for the **J&J** one dose vaccine that should be available sometime in May. As mentioned, we are extremely grateful to Coastal Carolina Hospital for not only providing our volunteers with vaccinations in January but also for inviting us to participate in two vaccine clinics in March. AccessHealth Lowcountry and their affiliation with Beaufort Memorial Hospital will be another source for



vaccinations beginning in April. AccessHealth will allow us to hold vaccine clinics at both our Ridgeland and Bluffton locations! As always, we will be asking you to help us with these 4-hour clinics which will be held on Thursdays.



Care When It Counts

Continuing with some updates from the SC Free Clinic Association report.

The demographics of our patient population has not changed a lot over the last few years even though we have certainly grown. Currently 65% of our population are women between the ages of 21-65. While we do have a few patients that are younger and a few that are older, the 21-65 age group is the largest. The demographics of our patients include: 33% that identify as Caucasian, 32% African American, 33% Hispanic and 2% as other. While we do see patients up to the 250% of the poverty level, most of our patients have incomes up to 200% of the level. (This would fall in line with the wages of the area for part time hospitality work.)

On April 22, Danitra Bovian from the SC Free Clinic Association will visit the clinic for a recertification review. These reviews are held every two years and our last review was held in 2019 just after we moved to our new location. Donna Rhodes has been working hard to get our certification manual in order. This requires a lot of work, but I know the association will be very impressed with all the hard work done by our staff and volunteers. Points of interest for the review will include procedure manuals for the clinic, pharmacy, and dental clinic; in addition to patient files and medical staff files. Board Meeting minutes and financial records

will also be scrutinized. April 22 will be a busy day for sure!

Dental News

As part of the Margo Family Dental Donation, funds were made available to hire a part-time dental hygienist. Initially, Patti will be at the clinic 12 hours a week, but as the clinic grows - she will add some additional hours. By the end of April, patients will be asked to visit the dental clinic after their medical appointment. At this visit the patient will be given a questionnaire to be completed on their dental history. From this questionnaire we will begin to schedule dental hygiene appointments. We are also working with three dentists who
