BJVIM Board of Directors

At the end of December, the BJVIM Board of Directors said goodbye to Board Members whose terms expired and welcomed in new Board Members. Joe Pantano, who had served on the Board for 6 years—most recently serving as the Board Secretary, and Dot Jeger, who had been on the Board for three years and was the Vice Chair and Chair of the Resource Development Committee, both rotated off. They will be greatly missed but they have both assured us they will continue to support BJVIM. In addition to replacing these two positions, the Board voted to expand its membership—opening the door for four additional members.

Thanks to the hard work of volunteers years ago, there has always been a volunteer representative on the Board. This was an unofficial position, and in December an amendment was made to the bylaws giving official recognition to the position. Care When It Counts

The SC Free Clinic Association Annual Report was due in January. Some interesting information from both clinics:

- 6646 appointments were provided to 1367
 patients (these appointments included in person clinic visits, telemedicine appointments,
 phone calls between nurse and patient,
 WelVista application appointments, eye exams
 and OPTOS exams.)
- **859 on-site tests** were performed including A1c, urinalysis, pap test, colposcopies, eye exams, EKG's and eye exams.
- **40 dental visits** were provided in our new dental clinic which opened in the fourth quarter of 2021.
- \$752,407.63 was raised in 2021.
- Direct services (value of services that were provided at the clinic) and indirect services (value of offsite services) equaled \$2,234,549!!!!
 That's 2 MILLION!!!
- **\$567** is the average annual cost to care for each patient.

(SC Fee Clinic Association has postponed their annual conference due to the increase in COVID cases. They are hopeful that the conference can take place later in the Spring.)
