

Dennis is Retiring



At the end of October Dennis will be retiring after being the Development Director for the past five years. In the early days of the clinic, you will remember the development department was staffed by hard-working volunteers. As the clinic grew with additional services and patients it was apparent that we needed a dedicated staff member to help us raise funds. We wrote a grant to the Community Foundation and received funds to expand the Resource Development Department which included hiring staff and expanding the donor management program. Dennis has raised over 4 million dollars since joining our team, which included \$350,000.00 for the dental clinic and \$500,000.00 for the Ridgeland Clinic. Added to his workload was the unusual circumstance that he had to work with his wife! The Community Foundation was very skeptical of this arrangement and so Dennis reported to the Board of Directors. We cannot thank Dennis enough for his hard work and dedication to our mission. Raising funds is a hard job, filled with lots of challenges and some setbacks especially when you write a grant that is not approved, but Dennis has done a remarkable job in all phases of resource development, and we thank him so much. Happy retirement Dennis!

Ridgeland Clinic Updates

September was an exciting time in the development of BJVIM!! After almost a year of looking for a new location for the Ridgeland Clinic the board negotiated the purchase of the building that houses the BJVIM clinic!! A huge thank you to Dennis who worked with a donor in

securing \$245,000.00 which was used as the downpayment for the building. Dennis also secured a grant from the SC Physicians Cares Charity for \$50,000 to go toward the building principal. These contributions allowed us to have a manageable monthly



mortgage payment. In addition, the Beacon of Hope Child Development Center will pay rent for the two units they currently occupy. We will be expanding the clinic into the fourth unit of the building sometime in the New Year. We are currently working with Court/Atkins on the design. Be on the lookout for updates!

Dental Program

Our dental Program is expanding to include providing dentures for our patients. For this new venture they will need a small lab. The current bathroom next to the dental clinic will be remodeled into a lab and storage area in January. Watch out for the completion of this new project in January!




Farewell Lee
